SYNOPSIS OF THE PLOT

ACT I.

The Baronets of Ruddigore have had a curse laid upon them that every one of them must commit one crime each day or perish in agony. Ruthven Murgatroyd, the nephew of the 21st Baronet, in dread of this deadly curse, fled from his ancestral home and lived a simple life as a young farmer in the village of Rederring (renowned for its professional bridesmaids) under the assumed name of Robin Oakapple, while his younger brother Despard, believing him to be dead, succeeded to the title with its attendant curse. Robin is in love with Rose Maybud, but being too shy to tell her so, asks his foster brother, Richard Dauntless, to speak for him. Richard also falls in love with Rose and when she shows her preference for Robin he reveals Robin's true identity to Despard. This means of course that Robin must now assume his rightful title of Sir Ruthven, and Despard, free of the curse, is able to return to his early love, Mad Margaret, whose mind had been affected by his earlier villainies. Rose, in horror of the curse, returns her affections once again to Richard.

ACT II.

Sir Ruthven (Robin) has been Baronet for a week and with Old Adam as his Steward, attempts to avoid committing his daily crime. However, in the Picture Gallery at Ruddigore Castle the ancestors depicted in the portraits, headed by Sir Roderic (the 21st Baronet) descend from their frames to remind him of his obligations. They are dissatisfied with his explanations and decree that he must abduct a lady. Old Adam is despatched for this purpose and returns with none other than Dame Hannah, once the sweetheart of Sir Roderic, who again descends from his frame to denounce Robin. With a typical Gilbertian twist, Robin shows that a Baronet of Ruddigore can only die by refusing to commit a crime, consequently such a refusal is tantamount to suicide, and, since suicide is itself a crime they ought never to have died at all and therefore must still be alive ! So the opera ends as Rose returns to Robin, while Richard finds consolation with Zorah (one of the bridesmaids), and Sir Roderic assuming his mundane role once more, is happily reunited with Dame Hannah.
